“Meekness”

Paul used the term “meekness” nine times (KJV) in his writings. Our Lord is characterized as being “meek” (Mat. 11:29). He further said: “Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth” (Mat. 5:5). The apostle Peter noted that we should strive toward a “meek and quiet spirit”(1 Pet. 3:4).

In developing such a character, we have to learn to “give a little,” be willing to see things from others’ point of view, not to strive for confrontations, but rather remember the words of the apostle: “For he that will love life, and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile: Let him eschew evil, and do good; let him seek peace, and ensue it. For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their prayers: but the face of the Lord is against them that do evil” (1 Pet. 3:10-12).

The Bible offers many examples of those whose character we would do well to emulate in our lives. One such example is Abraham in Genesis 13:1-12. We find (v. 2) he was rich in cattle, silver and gold. Lot also had much worldly goods (v. 5) and together, the land was not able to bear both and their belongings (v. 6). The herdsmen of Abram and Lot strove over this, however Abram exhibited the proper spirit. “And Abram said unto Lot, Let there be no strife, I pray thee, between me and thee, and between my herdsmen and thy herdsmen; for we be brethren. Is not the whole land before thee? separate thyself, I pray thee, from me: if thou wilt take the left hand, then I will go to the right; or if thou depart to the right hand, then I will go to the left” (Gen. 13:8-9). As we strive to develop such characteristics in our Christian lifestyle, we should also remember never to sacrifice the TRUTH for the sake of unity, or simply to “get along” with the religious world around us. The same Paul that spoke often of the need for “meekness” in one’s character, also used the term “stand fast” six different times in his writings. For instance: “Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong” (1 Cor. 16:13; cf. Gal. 5:1; Phi. 1:27; 4:1; 1 The. 3:8; 2 The. 2:15).

May we always remember the words of our Lord and the Hebrews writer: “And ye shall be hated of all men for my name’s sake: but he that endureth to the end shall be saved” (Mat.10:22). “Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;)” (Heb. 10:23).
