Mark 4:35-41 NKJV

On the same day, when evening had come, He said to them, "Let us cross over to the other side." Now when they had left the multitude, they took Him along in the boat as He was. And other little boats were also with Him. And a great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that it was already filling. But He was in the stern, asleep on a pillow. And they awoke Him and said to Him, "Teacher, do You not care that we are perishing?"

Then He arose and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace, be still!" And the wind ceased and there was a great calm. But He said to them, "Why are you so fearful? How is it that you have no faith?" And they feared exceedingly, and said to one another, "Who can this be, that even the wind and the sea obey Him!"

"The Sea Is His" - Trusting the Creator in the Storm

I was recently reminded that when Jesus calmed the storm in Luke 8:24, the disciples were shocked. But Scripture shows we shouldn't be. Psalm 95:5 reminds us, "The sea is His, for He made it," and John 1:3 declares that all things were made through Him. The One who stood in that boat was not merely a teacher—He was the Creator, commanding what He Himself had formed.

If Jesus made the seas, then He knows how to guide you through yours.

Psalm 107:28–29 says He calms storms. Psalm 65:7 says He stills the roaring waves and the "tumult of the peoples." No fear, no anxiety, no doubt is too great for the Creator who controls them all.

The disciples woke Jesus in fear—not faith. Yet He didn't rebuke them for crying out. He rebuked the storm for threatening them. Fearful disciples are still loved disciples.

Whatever storm is shaking you today, turn it over to the One who formed the seas with His hands. The waves know His voice.

You can trust Him to calm yours.
