Who Is Yahweh?

Scripture Text: Exodus 3:13–15

Before Israel ever cried out in Egypt, God had already spoken to Abraham.

God told Abraham that his offspring would become strangers in a land that was not theirs. They would be afflicted and serve another people. But God also promised that He would judge that nation and bring His people out.

So before there was a Pharaoh, there was a promise. Before there was bondage, there was the Word of God. Before there was an Exodus, there was the God who had bound Himself to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

When Exodus opens, generations have passed, yet the promise is still alive. But now the people of promise are enslaved.

A new Pharaoh rises who does not know Joseph. He looks at what God has blessed and sees a threat. Fear becomes policy. Policy becomes oppression. Oppression becomes bondage. The people groan beneath a tyrannical kingdom of fear and death.

And then Scripture tells us: God heard. God remembered. God saw. God knew. He remembered His covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. He had not forgotten His people, His promise, or the purpose He was carrying forward through them.

Then, from a burning bush in the wilderness, God made Himself known.

Moses asked for His name, and God said, “I AM WHO I AM.” In our English Bibles, when LORD appears in all capital letters, it represents God’s covenant name: Yahweh. He is the LORD, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.

Yahweh is not a distant name to be defined, but the living God who makes Himself known by redeeming His people. He is not an idea, an idol, a force, or a distant power. He speaks, remembers, sees, knows, comes down, and acts in history.

That is the great question Exodus answers: Who is Yahweh?

Pharaoh asks it in defiance: “Who is the LORD, that I should obey his voice?” The Exodus becomes the answer. Yahweh heard the people’s cry, broke the grip of the oppressor, covered them by blood, brought them through water, and turned their groaning into song.

He is the I AM, the covenant-faithful Redeemer who moves in history to save the people of His promise. And through Jesus Christ, we come to know Yahweh most fully. In Him, God has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

The Yahweh who came down to deliver Israel from Egypt has come near in Christ to redeem us from sin, death, and bondage, and to bring us into the freedom and life of His kingdom.
